

Good evening all. First off, thank you for registering for the 20th Annual Joint Special Operations 10K. The below will address entry onto Fort Bragg for non-DoD ID card holders. I put together this list based on your answer to the ID question on the registration form. If it is a mistake and you do have a DoD ID card, please disregard this e-mail and enter Fort Bragg as you always do.

The event is listed with Fort Bragg as the Joint Special Operations 10K or JSO 10K

We have been granted Special Event access, with all of our Non-card holders needing to enter Fort Bragg at the **Randolph Street gate**. Names will be given to the Captain of the Guards Thursday 10 November and you will/should just be allowed in, but are still subject to a random inspection as are we all at any time. You must present a proper ID, such as a driver's license etc...

NOTICE: A few months ago, Bragg Blvd was closed to public traffic and there is now a loop that by-passes the section of Bragg Blvd that intersects with Randolph Street. It is accessible, but the issue is that there is not a highway exit sign on the loop, so please pay close attention to where you need to exit onto Randolph Street. Allow yourself plenty of time in case you have to make a U-turn and come back to it.

For those wishing to save some time and be able to enter any gate on Bragg, you can go to the All American gate visitors center and request a visitors pass which is then good for 90 days. Unfortunately, the Fort Bragg access pre-registration form on the Bragg website: <http://www.bragg.army.mil/directorates/DES/pmo/Pages/AIE.aspx> is not working.

****NOTE- If you are riding as a passenger of a DoD ID card holder, they are considered trusted travelers and you will be authorized access with them, but you must show a valid ID at the gate.
